Update on the Woonerf A

number of City projects align well with the woonerf model and we anticipate approval of a LQC (lighter, quicker, cheaper) option to avoid infrastructure heavy, expensive roadworks. That said, we've learned that road works are expected in the next few years



as very old City services are upgraded. So...why not trial some ideas in a low cost, neighbourhood driven pilot ahead of investing in infrastructure?

Issues to note

- * Development can work with or against the community focus of a woonerf
- 1301 Hillside: as proposed, will increase traffic on Acton, Cedar Hill, Kings, Mt. Stephen, Capital Heights & Empire. City staff response that this is unlikely is not credible: vehicles (from the north, east & west) simply cannot reach the building without an increase to cut-through traffic.
- 2700 Avebury: in-fill housing is a sensitive approach to increasing density; owners have agreed to request a variance from the sidewalk requirement, just as Cam B did at 2695 Capital Heights, with pollinators to come.
- Alternatives to the environmentally invasive road works typically resulting from the Subdivision Services Bylaw can, instead, be plantings, road art and way-finding de-incentivizes non-local traffic and builds community!
