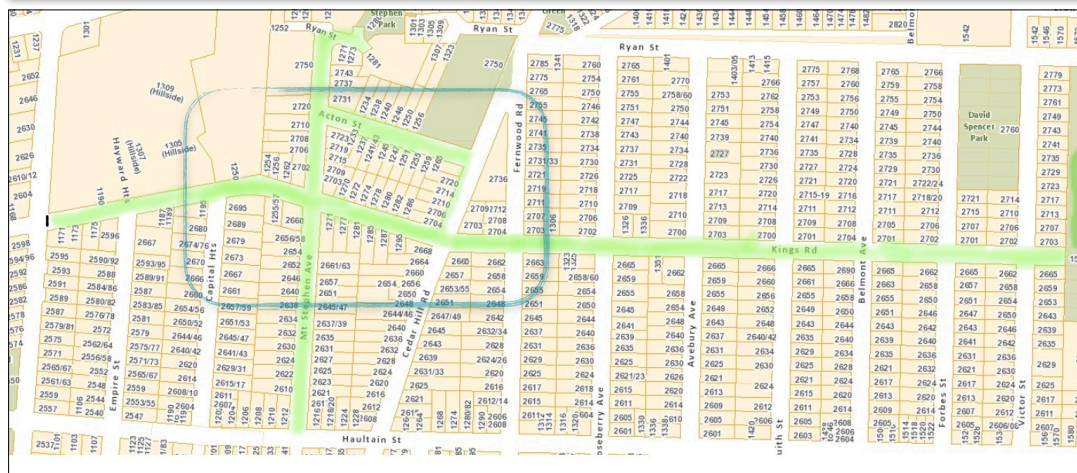


Oaklands Rise News
