

Highlights from the Public Surveys (Click to enlarge the graph)



✓96% explained why they're on the streets in 2018. In 2023, we asked for ranked preferences.

Top activities are: exercise, enjoyment of the area, relaxation.

76% walk, 40% cycle, 18% drive the Woonerf (Oaklands Park-Capital Heights)
4% use assistive devices. 9% push a stroller. 3% are skateboard/scooter fans.
71% support art elements: 4% do not.
66% do not want sidewalks: 7% do, doubting that drivers will cooperate.
Happily, there's great support for slow speeds for the safety of children, seniors, dog walkers, and ALL who love the area.


Don't take the Woonerf for granted.

- ☑ 99% of respondents are willing to drive at 20 km/h or less for the 2-3 blocks to reach a connector or arterial thoroughfare. Some respondents did share concern about increased cut-through driving. That concern guided a street painting (with mixed results) and later feedback to City of Victoria staff.
- ☑ 84% will volunteer to maintain & enhance the Woonerf pitching in through a variety of activities. Here's a challenge: how do we take that willingness into active volunteering?! Many forgot that being on the mailing list does not reveal who you are in a blind survey—please, reach out!
