Strolled down Kings Rd. lately? A low, loose-packed stone fence gives shape to where a bench will one day provide rest for walkers or just a place to enjoy birdsong. Strategically placed rocks mean that C's scooter will no longer be blocked by parked cars when leaving home.

Neighbours on steep hills see a tendency for drivers to pick up speeds. Various approaches to this challenge can slow traffic, but some say a Fernwood Rd. example made the problem worse! Focusing on the psychology of drivers with living streets in mind invites local characteristics to guide the way.
